


 The importance of reading with your child from a very early age

The Importance of reading...






- 1. Reading improves vocabulary Children sometimes stumble over their words, do not know how to pronounce them or what they mean.
- 2. Better comprehension Kids who are encouraged to read at an early age have better comprehension of things around them.
- 3. Develops critical thinking skills The more you read, the deeper your understanding becomes about what you're reading and its application.
- 4. Improves memory Every time you read a book, you have to remember the setting of the book, the characters, their backgrounds, their history, their personalities, the sub-plots and so much more. As your brain learns to remember all this, your memory becomes better.
- 5. Builds confidence Reading books sharpens many skills and all together they'll build confidence.
- 6. Improves writing skills Children who learn to read also tend to develop better writing skills.
- 7. Improves focus and concentration When you read a book, all of your attention is focused on the story
- 8. It develops emotions






English alphabetic code






Book Bag Books

Top Tips - Storytime

- Make it a treat
- 2. Make it a special quiet time
- 3. Show curiosity
- 4. Read story once without stopping
- Chat about the story
- 6. Avoid testing with questions
- 7. Link to other stories and experiences
- 8. Read favourites over and over again
- Use different voices
- 10.Love the book


