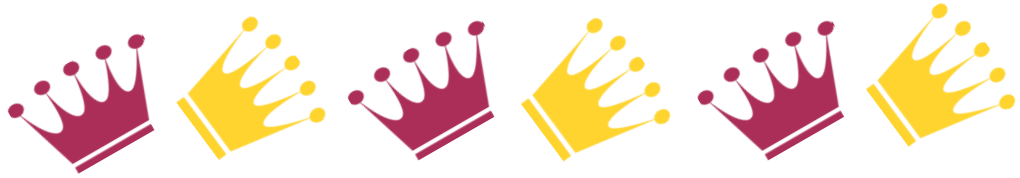

Supporting your child through suspected bullying

As children form friendships, particularly in school, it can be a challenge to determine if negative behaviours have escalated into bullying. If you have concerns, it's essential to handle the situation delicately and offer steady emotional support.

FIVE STEPS TO SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD WITH POSSIBLE BULLYING

1 HAVE OPEN DIALOGUE

Listen to your child, giving your full attention. Ask open ended questions such as "Can you tell me what happened today?"

2 OBSERVE FOR SIGNS OF BULLYING

Watch out for changes in behaviour such as reluctance to go to school, complaining of tummyache or headaches.

3 TEACH STRATEGIES TO MANAGE SITUATIONS

Help your child rehearse responses for negative situations and urge them to seek an adult for assistance.

4 WORK WITH SCHOOL

Document any specific incidents and share your early concerns to enable teachers to monitor in school.

5 EMPOWER YOUR CHILD

Encourage them to participate in activities they enjoy and excel in so they feel confident, especially in school.



We are sure that, like us, you as parents and carers realise the importance of attendance and punctuality. At Christ the King we continue to work hard to maintain our excellent attendance levels and to reduce incidences of lateness.

Poor punctuality can also disadvantage children in many ways:

- * Being frequently late adds up to lost learning. For example, arriving 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks of the year
- * When children are late they find it harder to settle in to the routine of the day
- * When children arrive late they often miss key messages and teaching which continues to have an effect on their learning for the rest of the lesson or day

Getting here on time every day really is important in helping your child to become a happy and successful learner.
